### Dear Families

The debate on school funding has been front-page news these last couple of weeks with many stories giving different versions and perspectives of what is a critical time for Catholic education. The **Gonski 2.0** amendment to the **Australian Education Act** proposes an increase in funding for the Catholic education sector and a redistribution of money to the needier schools in the country. Both of these proposals can only be seen as a positive outcome of the amendment, and as Catholics we would agree that those in greater need deserve more resources available to them.

What hasn't been explained clearly by the Turnbull government are the restrictions put on Catholic schools systems, like that of Broken Bay, with the expectation that ALL parents in schools with a higher Socio-Economic Status (SES) rating are capable of paying more for their children's education. Additionally, any increase in funding to St Kieran's would be required to be re-directed to needier schools. While it can be argued that families at St Kieran's may be "better off" than families from lower SES areas, this does not mean that every family can take on fee-increases and that they have disposable income available to cover any such increase.

As is the case with any discussion, it is important to gather all the facts and then weigh-up each argument before reaching a conclusion. Reading and listening to both sides can leave one somewhat perplexed as to what is true and what is "fake news"! Being told some of the facts is not being told the whole story and can be viewed as "a sin of omission". It is vital that we hear the facts and for that reason the Director of Schools, Mr Peter Hamill, will be speaking in the Parish Hall next Thursday night. Please RSVP on the link sent home during the week in one of Peter's letters if you are able to come along.

On a brighter note, thank you to the teachers and Mrs Alyson Perry for their assistance in hosting the **1-2-3 Magic** program at our school over the past three weeks. It was an excellent opportunity for parents to take part in a theoretical and practical learning opportunity and to refine those skills so important to being a parent.

Please keep the Conlon family in your prayers. Their grandfather recently passed. May he enjoy the peace of the risen Christ.

We have had two great rehearsals this week working on our respective pieces for our up-coming performance at Forest High on 19 June.

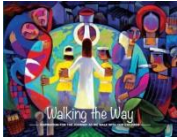
I would like to thank everyone for coming at the correct time of 7:15am this week as it has made rehearsal time more efficient. The children have really benefitted already.

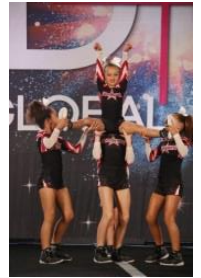
## **Walking the Way**
