Dear Families

The Gonski 2.0 amendment to the Australian Education Act is up for debate next week in the Senate. There continues to be a great deal of lobbying from the Catholic sector, including our Director of Schools, Peter Hamill, our Bishop, Most Rev Peter Comensoli and the Acting Director of the National Catholic Education Commission, Danielle Cronin, to the relevant senators in Canberra. At this stage it appears to be the Greens who are holding the decision in their hands. Our NSW Greens senator is Lee Rhiannon and can be contacted by email at senator.rhiannon@aph.gov.au

Peter Hamill contacted me yesterday and asked me to advise any parent who is considering handing in enrolment forms to the local state public schools to hold off on visiting the school but instead deliver their forms to the Hon Tony Abbott's office at Manly. His electoral office address is **Level 2, 17 Sydney Road, Manly, NSW, 2095**

You may have read today's *Manly Daily* with the staged delivery of enrolment forms to Balgowlah Heights Public School from many of the St Cecilia's parents. This was more a symbolic gesture rather than actual enrolments, however the message was very clear; Catholic schools could lose enrolments if the changes come into effect.

While we should be aware of the implications for St Kieran's and the future of Catholic education in this country, I do ask that you refrain from any further action until the outcome is clear, however in the meantime, please consider completing the petition that was shared this week as well as continuing to write to the various key ministers including Lee Rhiannon and Simon Birmingham, and our local member, Tony Abbott.

I would like to thank all those who were able to attend the Parent Forum last week in the church and those who were able to attend the P&F meeting on Tuesday night. The situation is complex and requires a number of voices speaking out against such a proposal.

On a much brighter note, congratulations and thank you to our Year 6 students and their teachers on their three day visit to Canberra last week. The teachers commented on the number of guides and facilitators who spoke so highly of our children and their excellent knowledge and wonderful manners, which were very much appreciated. A very special thank you to Mrs Uchino, Miss Kassis and Mr Sheedy for preparing and looking after the children so well and giving up time away from their families.

Mrs Ariane Howard (Year 5H) is finishing today at St Kieran's in anticipation of a new baby. Ariane has been given medical advice to finish earlier than first expected. I thank Ariane for her contribution to St Kieran's this year and wish her and her family all the very best on the safe arrival of their new baby. I would like to welcome Miss Laura Cronin to St Kieran's who will be taking over in Year 5 for the remainder of the year.


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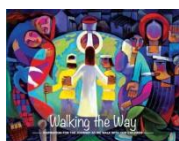
TIP OF THE WEEK
